



Enabling the Business of Agriculture : Genesis and timeline



Relevance of EBA indicators

"Both the quality and the efficiency dimensions of business regulations, as captured by the EBA indicators, show significant correlations with countries' agricultural productivity. On average, agricultural productivity is higher when transaction costs are lower and countries adhere to a higher number of regulatory good practices"



The Enabling the Business of Agriculture indicators and analysis not only help strengthen the information base that can be used for informed policy dialogue but can also encourage regulations that ensure safety and quality of agricultural inputs, goods and services while minimizing costs and time burdens
