Nearly all jobs must evolve

40% of all jobs are at risk due to climate change because they are sustained by industries dependent on a healthy climate and ecosystem.

Investments aimed at reaching net zero carbon emissions by 2050, including sectors such as:

- ✓Clean and renewable energy, ✓Construction,
- ✓ Sustainable agriculture,
- ✓ Recycling and waste management

Have the potential to create 8.4 million jobs for young people by 2030.



A bold new Pact for the Future

To support a just transition and boost decent jobs for youth in a sustainable economy, ILO, UNEP, and UNICEF are working together with young people, governments, private sector, social partners, and education partners to accelerate commitments towards green jobs for young people.

By 2030 the Pact aims to:

- 1. Create 1 million new green jobs for youth, with a particular focus on young women;
- 2. Accelerate the greening of 1 million existing jobs;
- 3. Support 10,000 young entrepreneurs to establish and/or grow sustainable green businesses, while contributing to the creation of green jobs for their peers
