









What is a just transition to a low-carbon climate resilient economy?

A Just Transition involves maximising the **social and economic opportunities** of climate and environmental action while minimising and carefully managing any **challenge** – including through effective **social dialogue** and respect for fundamental principles and rights at work and human rights.

2023 International Labour Conference – General Discussion on just transition

187 ILO Member states

Reaffirmed the need for urgent and ambitious action to advance a just transition

► Endorsed the ILO Guidelines as the central reference for policy making, and the framework for action based on four building blocks

▶ Reaffirmed ILO's leadership role on just transition in the multilateral

system


